

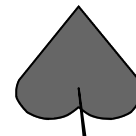

Platform for Legislative Director Election- Mike Hays

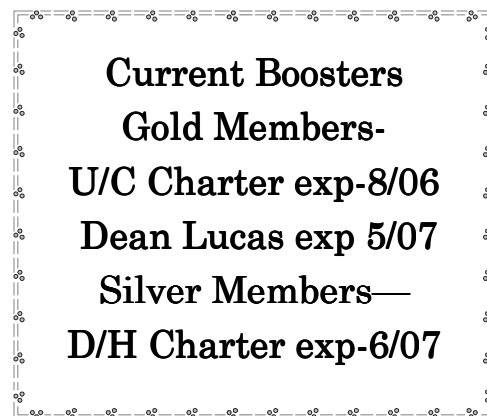
1. Work closely with the organization leadership, charter legislative coordinators and the membership to have a more visible presence year round and on the hill during the legislative session.
2. Encourage the membership to be involved in supporting candidates who have or will support the efforts of CMT/ABATE. We can not wait until after the elections to identify the candidates who may or may not support our efforts. CMT/ABATE members must be proactive in the election process starting now.
3. Reach out to motorcyclists in those parts of the state where CMT/ABATE has little or no presence. Encourage the charters to increase the organization's presence at motorcycle events throughout the state.
4. Utilize every resource within the organization and pull together a team to define our mission and implement our strategies. I would also like to see CMT/ABATE encourage and fund more member participation at conferences and events.
5. Meet with EVERY legislator and when possible, with a constituent of that legislator to solicit bill sponsorship or identify those who support all or some of the CMT/ABATE legislative initiatives.
6. Establish a CMT/ABATE "Action Alert" phone tree and e-mail list to alert the membership to take action in support of CMT/ABATE legislative efforts. Enhance overall communications to the members and the general public.
7. Work with the webmaster to make more information available to members and non- members through the website.
8. Establish a high profile freedom rally and ride to the capital during the legislative session. Enhance and improve the "lobby day" experience by having position papers for attendees to present to their legislators.
9. Hold regular legislative team meetings during the session and as necessary during the election cycle. Continue with the fall legislative retreat and continue with "election cycle" retreats to enhance member's efforts on behalf of those candidates who will support CMT/ABATE legislative initiatives.
10. Establish a Leadership and Legislative Workshop for members to learn effective leadership and lobbying techniques.

Nashville

The Nashville Charter meeting of CMT/ABATE was held July 18 at Logan's Roadhouse in Nashville with 34 members and guests present. Invited guests included John Milliken, administrator of the Tennessee Motorcycle Rider Education Program, candidate for the 5th Congressional House District Tom Kovatch, CMT founding member Paul Maloney and long time supporter Red Rea of R&B Cycles. Bullet Riders MC President "Doc" also paid a visit as did several members of both Sumner and Music City chapters of CMT/ABATE. Tennessee House member, Representative Ben West, will speak at the August meeting.

Candidate Kovatch, running against Rep. Jim Cooper (he introduced the federal helmet mandate), offered his thoughts on the upcoming election and asked members for their support. Paul Maloney (a lifetime member) had the attention of everyone in the room as he spoke of the history of CMT (before ABATE was added) and the origins of the motorcycle rider education program. He explained how the organization worked to get the program started and how the program was funded by legislation supported and worked by the legislative team. .

John Milliken gave an excellent overview of the rider training program and talked of the education program Cindy Davidson has presented on behalf of CMT/ABATE and the continuing efforts to refine and launch the program into the schools using \$75,000 of TEA-LU grant money from the federal government. He also talked of several initiatives in the awareness arena and ongoing efforts to grow the rider-training program, which trained over 8,000 riders in 2005 and is on track to train over 8,200 in 2006. The extra fees motorcyclists pay for registration and licensing generates over \$280,000 per year and the current fund has a balance in excess of \$700,000. John reiterated his offer for any member of CMT/ABATE to contact him with questions or to visit his office in Nashville.

Treasurer "Blue" reports \$745 on hand with no outstanding liabilities.

Carol Simpson offered a short report on the recent meeting of M.I.C.E., Motorcyclists Involved in Campaigns and Elections and handed out spreadsheets and information on the upcoming elections. Any member with information or comments on candidates should contact Carol at csfreedom@aol.com. Carol will be updating candidate information throughout the campaign season.

The final order of business was to ratify the slate of officers for the upcoming year, as follows.

Director – Shell Summerlin Assistant Director – Kirk Butler Secretary - Julie Hickey

Treasurer – Tim Hickey Public Relations – Wally Baez Activities – Buffalo

In closing, it has been my pleasure to be at the helm of the Nashville charter the last two and a half years. From the days we were lucky to get 5 people to a meeting to last nights capacity crowd, the charter has grown to become an active involved group of freedom fighters. I want to thank all the members who have made a contribution to the success and a special thanks to Kirk Butler, the assistant director for the last two years. I look forward to serving the organization as Legislative Director as we strive to enhance our safety and education programs and gain freedom of choice for all motorcyclists in Tennessee.
