

YOUR RIGHTS YOUR RIDE



We best get right to it. The helmet law modification bill died in Senate Finance and I take full responsibility. It was killed by politics and not on merit. The lobby team did an almost perfect job of working the bill. Senator Thelma Harper was the nail in the coffin. After telling three different folks that she would support the bill and give it a yes vote, she went along with the opposition and hit us with a "NO". Believe it or not, there may have been something positive come out of that committee. Two committee members asked for the Department of Tourism to weigh in on the bill. We have always wanted to get tourism included in the fiscal note. This may have opened the door for that to happen. Many members of the General Assembly had the same question, "Why didn't a bill with a positive fiscal note pass?" We didn't have the only bill with a positive fiscal note to be killed. On the House side, the unethical and disrespectful actions of Finance Committee Chairman, Charles Sargent, to prevent passage

of certain bills has drawn a lot of criticism from fellow legislators. These things could contribute in a positive manner to getting a helmet law modification bill through the 110th General Assembly. Representative Jay Reedy and Senator Kerry Roberts have both asked to sponsor the bill again. We will run the same bill again in 2017.

The 109th General Assembly did give us some wins. We passed the memorial ride bill, making it possible to show respect to the deceased by removing our helmets in a funeral, body escort or memorial ride. Prior to the passage of this, some counties permitted folks to ride without a helmet in these three cases, but it was illegal by State law. We were able to get a little protection for the Riders Education Fund, when the Governor offered not to touch the fund as long as he is in office. We have continued to gain some support for lane splitting, but not enough to get anything passed yet. This will be a slow process of educating both legislators and the general public. The important thing is



to keep moving forward with our efforts.

On April 10th, we held the first in a series of regional legislative meetings. There will be at least one meeting in both the western and eastern parts of the State followed by a legislative retreat in July to set the final agenda for the 2017 and 2018 sessions. These meetings are open to everyone. This is your chance to offer input into legislative issues and get answers to any questions you might have on what the legislative team is doing.

Those that are interested in running for Legislative Director need to get their resume turned in by the June Board of Directors Meeting. Election for this position will be at the September BOD. Personally, I think every member should take time to serve the organization and this is a very important position of service. Anybody can bitch and fuss, but it takes true character to take action on behalf of others.

Next month we will be posting the voting records of legislators on our bills. With this being an election year, this should be valuable information for all voters. Some have supported us with more than their votes. We will also be listing those that have given that little something extra that sets them part and makes them true friends of CMT/ABATE, Inc

I also saw first-hand how our lanesplitting proposal could get a little out of hand. Don't let the legislators see this or they'll never support us:






