October 21, 2019

On December 8 2019, CMT/ABATE; Inc. will have a board of directors meeting. Immediately following the BOD, the Safety and Awareness committee will meet to make decisions on the spending of the MREP grant money.

Every charter should have a member in attendance. It is preferable, that someone other than the Charter director attend. More than one from each charter can attend. We will make decisions about ordering products, some possible changes in the grant contract(s), and garner support for the existing projects and discuss possible new projects and locations for events.

There are two initiatives approved in this grant that spans from June 20, 2019 to June 19, 2020. Projects are designated by the grant contract, but there is some little bit of wiggle room, as long at the efforts fall within the Look Twice Save a Life projects or the Don't Ride Fried projects. We have only spent a little over \$200 so far.

Facts, figures, suggestions and decisions will be the categories of discussion.

If your charter does not have representation, we will make decisions for you. This grant is intended for STATE WIDE use. Not limited to any one charter area, but that is where the VOLUNTEERS supposedly are. Members at large are TOTALLY WELCOME AND ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND. Bring your ideas and enthusiasm!!!!

Legislative Director's Ramblings

Hello everyone- We, CMT/ABATE Incorporated, are an advocacy group for Tennessee motorbike riders since our initial founding and our mission remains that we work as a team for the rights, safety and freedom of Tennessee motorcycle riders. Faces and names may have changed- the core mission remains the same.

Well, after arriving to the Meetings of the Minds in Bloomington, Minn., the last thing I expected was to sit in a meeting from 9am to 9pm Friday and Saturday, but it was all worth it and very informative. I very much look forward to attend next year in Indianapolis. What did I learn? LOTS!

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation is a very important organization as they lobby and work on a Federal level in DC as CMT/ABATE works on a State level. I would encourage everyone to become a member; that not only helps keep the wheels moving financially but benefits you as well. For every member that can add one member, would double the membership, for the MRF (doing the same for CMT/ABATE would also double the membership).

The upcoming year has its challenges for the MRF, as they will continue to lobby to work against motorcycle profiling. The term means the practice of any law enforcement agency using criteria pertaining to motorcycle riders and/or their clothing or accessories as a determining factor in deciding to stop, detain or proceed with search, seizure or arrest without probable cause and doing so violates Constitutional

rights. Unfortunately, many law enforcement agents in States consider patches as "gang" members which they use to try and confiscate guns. To date, there are 212 reported cases here in Tennessee. It is also done at restaurants, motels etc... If you are interested, please go to "Motorcycle Profiling Project.com" by December 31st. There is bipartisan help involved with this issue including Elijah Cummings (recently deceased and we hope will be replaced soon) and NAACP.

MRF will also advocate autonomous vehicles to require testing and responsiveness to motorcycles. Not that there is anything against "driverless cars" but at least be SURE they are capable of detecting motorcycles because not all do at the moment.


MRF also fiercely oppose the Federal mandated helmet law as States were "blackmailed by defunding" to push for the law to begin with. MRF is also working on rider education programs with school visits required for motorcycle awareness which already happens in a few States already for at least one hour. It's aimed toward teenagers about the age before licensed to drive.

Having said all that, rather its MRF or CMT/ABATE, here are my thoughts I learned and observed. MEMBERSHIP is key! Fewer members are less money. I was honored to receive the 2019 Greatest % Growth Award for ABATE of Tennessee, so a HUGE congratulations to all. Also while there, I witnessed passion, well informed people from ALL walks of life, but

most importantly, UNITY! Regardless of views, politics, beliefs or differences; WE ALL have the same goals.

BTW, they held a ringing of the bell to honor those we've lost so I mentioned Skeeter, Ernest (SWSR Safety) and Jerry King. So needless to say, I was extremely honored to represent CMT/ABATE of Tennessee and look forward to doing all I can to help make a difference. 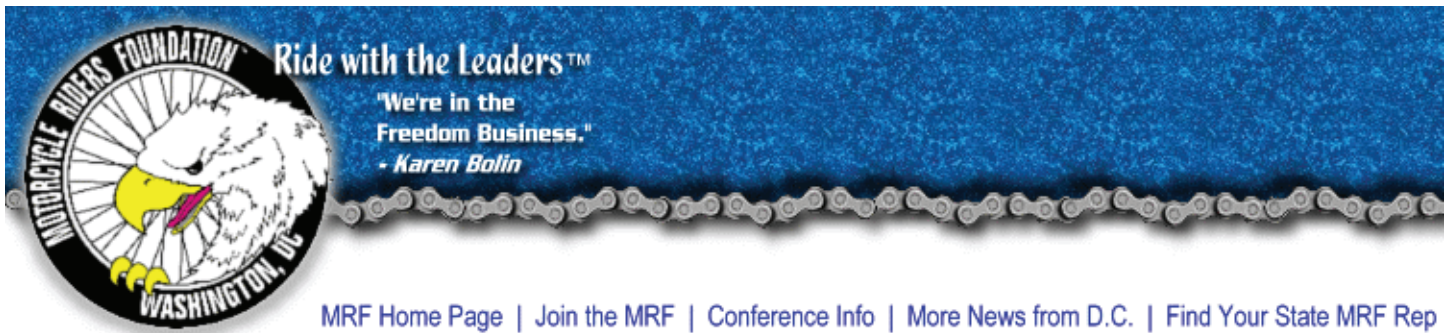

He is remembered by many area motorcycle enthusiasts as their happy smiley Motorcycle Education Teacher. Jeff was an auto mechanic by trade and worked for ARA Vending, Winnebago Industries and finally fulfilled a lifelong dream of starting his own business, McCubbin Trophy & Engraving with wife, Lee. He enjoyed tinkering under the hood of a car, camping at Freedom Park with his many close friends, and opening up the throttle on his 1981 Sturgis Classic Double Belt Drive Harley Davidson. He also loved riding his tractor around his acreage, and the satisfaction of cracking open a cold beer. He was a colorful storyteller and famously recounted the night he unknowingly sat around the campfire with Willie G Davidson on one of his many trips to Sturgis.

Jeff's Celebration of Life will be held on Saturday, September 28. "Jeff's Last Ride" will depart from the Forest City Rider Ed. Range, Winnebago Gate 1 parking lot at 1:00.
