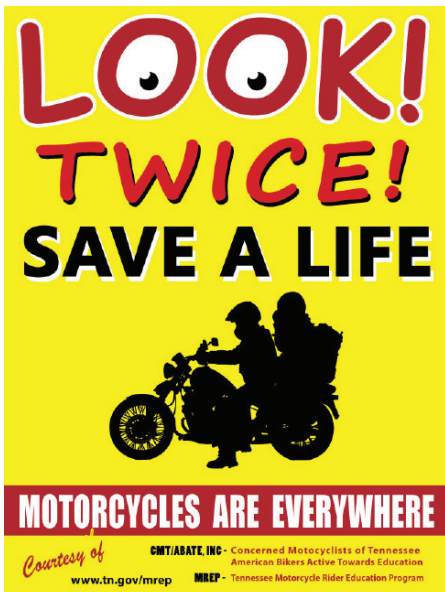

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation would like to congratulate board member and ex-officio Deborah Butitta, on her induction into the Sturgis Motorcycle Hall of Fame during the 81st Annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. Butitta was the recipient of the "Freedom Fighter Award" which recognizes individuals who have made a long-term, positive impact on the motorcycle rights community!

The Freedom Fighter Award recognizes the sacrifices individuals across the nation, and world, have made to protect the rights of motorcyclists through their efforts in the political arena and in grassroots motorcyclists' rights organizations.

Deborah Butitta was born and raised in Rockford, IL. To a modest family. As a young girl Deborah was around motor-

cycles and by high school could be seen riding on the back of her boyfriend's motorcycle. In the early 90's Deborah was introduced to ABATE of AZ, in 1994 Deborah joined the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. During her tenure with the Motorcycle Riders Foundation Deborah held 3 different positions, including Corporate Secretary for 8 years. Currently Deborah is on the Motorcycle Riders Foundation Board of Directors, and she is the Chairman for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation Awareness and Education Board of Directors.

- Stopped federal legislation that would have classified any group of three or more riders wearing similar clothing as a 'gang'
- Stopped unfair insurance provisions targeting motorcyclists
- Helped to overturn road bans attempting to stop motorcyclists from using roads we pay taxes to maintain
- Overturned the 'superbike' ban attempting to stop the sale of high-performing motorcycles
- Stopped governmental agencies from using taxpayer dollars to lobby against motorcycling

- Continuing to ensure that motorcycles are accounted for in autonomous (self-driving) vehicle designs
- Working to stop motorcycle profiling and bogus check points by law enforcement agencies
- Supporting voluntary rider education efforts to decrease motorcycle accidents, and helping rider education programs to obtain government grants
- Protected the motorcycle industry from onerous and restrictive federal regulations that would have severely damaged the motorcycle aftermarket, and along with it, all riders' ability to modify their bikes the way they want to.
- Continuing to work to stop distracted driving
- Stopped unfair EPA regulations that, if endorsed, would have forced riders to use only 'Approved OEM' parts on their bikes
- For more than 30 years, the MRF has led a network of strong motorcyclists' rights organizations protecting rider's rights. The MRF has made sure that we can ride the kind of bikes we want to ride, with the people we want to ride with, wearing what we want to wear,

on the roads we want to ride, and make the changes to our bikes that we want to make.

MRF State Rep Report –

Luck is when preparation meets opportunity.

– Neil Peart

The summer is coming to an end, at least “officially”, and the milder temperatures of autumn can be an opportunity for some of the best riding weather of the year. I intend to take full advantage of that. But preparation is key when the seasons change. Be ready for quickly dropping temperatures, sudden rain, earlier nightfall, and as the weeks go by, perhaps some frost on the road.

About the time you are reading this, I should have recently gotten back from a short ride down to Atlanta to attend this year’s Meeting of the Minds. A small group of us will represent CMT/ABATE at this national motorcyclists’ rights conference. I’ll have details of what went on there in next months newsletter, but I am sure it will be informative and inspirational for all who attend.

Not much has changed in DC since last

month (or at least not much directly affecting motorcycling). It seems DC can go months at a time with absolutely nothing progressing, and then BOOM!, everything changes in an instant. The Highway Funding Bill was set to expire last September, but neither the House nor the Senate took any action on it, and they wound up just extending it for another year. This year, the House introduced their highway funding bill June 4th, and passed it on July 1st – less than a month later. A little over a month after that, the Senate passed their highway funding bill. And then it just sat there...with no apparent actions taking place...as the September 30th deadline approaches... What will happen next? Your guess is as good as mine. This is all tied up in the highly publicized (and politicized) negotiations around “Infrastructure”. The goal is to get it done and on the Presidents desk by October 1st. But that doesn’t leave much time, and they may have to try another extension. If they do extend it, I would guess it will be a short-term extension, perhaps a month or two. They absolutely want to get the infrastructure stuff passed this year – next

year they will want to concentrate on the mid-term election cycle.

And with the coming election cycle, new opportunities open up for us to work with our US Representatives. Not only on pending legislation, but also on something very dear to their own heart – their campaign for re-election. Connections made by working with the campaign staff during the election cycle can open up many doors when we need to talk to the Representative or their staff. The opportunity to get on good terms with our legislators and staff like this is a critical part of preparing to move our own agenda forward, and securing our right to...

MRF Flash Alert - Tesla Crashes

August 16, 2021

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) wrote, in a document released Monday, that it has identified 11 crashes since 2018 in which a Tesla vehicle using the company’s driver assistance system, struck one or more vehicles involved in an emergency response situation. Four of those crashes occurred in 2021.

NHTSA now plans on studying the Advanced Driver Assistance System, otherwise known as “autopilot”, in the nearly 765,000 Tesla vehicles produced between

2014 and 2021.

For several years, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF), in cooperation with our state motorcyclist rights partners, have warned of the need for increased oversight of this new technology. Allowing vehicles to be deployed on our nation’s roadways, that cannot adequately detect and respond to all roadway users, is dangerous. Regulators and auto manufacturers should work together to ensure tragic crashes, like the ones found in this report, never happen again.


