

#### **Legislative Director's Ramblings**

Howdy everyone -We, CMT/ABATE, Incorporated are an advocacy group for Tennessee motorbike riders since our initial founding and our mission remains that we work as a team for the rights, safety, and freedom of Tennessee motorbike riders. Faces and names may have changed – the core mission remains the same.

Ah, we are past the holiday season and I hope we are all ready for action during 2019. On Tuesday 08, January I was at the Cordell Hull building to see our allies and meet some of the new folks. They were all busy with their first orders of business so I saw but a few people - kind of what I expected. But I was able to make a better grasp of the office locations since there

were no crowds in the hallways.

So, how do things look? The Senate committees that we must pass; Transportation and Finance are chaired by people who strongly oppose our freedom of choice effort. But the membership of these committees is made of the same people, more or less, who were on them during 2017-2018 session so the overall makeup is about the same. The House has major changes and I am pleased to say that the Transportation and Finance committees there are not chaired by people who oppose us - now there are members on both committees who do oppose us, of course. What exactly is our strategy? We don't know yet since our sponsors were not aware of committee changes

until about 09, or 10, January 2019 so whatever plans they have may need to be tweaked.

The best way to understand our strategy and execution is to stay in touch via email, telephone, our website, or Facebook. The legislators whose hearts we must change reside mainly in eastern Tennessee and while our membership is a bit scant in that region, we do have about three men who are ready to engage the conversation.

I'll close with a repeat of my December 2018 column. We have our annual New Year's Kickoff Party planned for Saturday 19, January 2019 at the Clarion Hotel near the intersection of 1st Street and Spring Street on the north side of Nashville, Tennessee and all of you, your family, and friends are invited to attend the most groovy party in Nashville. The meal and party will begin about 5:30 or so but starting at about 2:00 members of the Executive Board will be present for a 2-hour informal General membership meeting. In my opinion these are quite productive sessions where all members are invited to sit in, listen, ask questions, and make suggestions without the formality normally associated with a business meeting.

#### MRF State Rep Report -

2018 ended in a manner that reflects the general political environment in the US. After a couple of weeks discussing / warning / threatening a government shutdown, we went into the Christmas holiday with a quarter of the federal government closed. And that has extended through mid-January, with no end in sight at the time of this article. The two sides both put out their talking points, but no one seems to actually want to negotiate a deal to get things moving again.

So what does that have to do with motorcycles? Well, it made it very difficult to get anything done in the final part of the year. However, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation did have some successes for 2018, and we were at least able to raise awareness on several of our issues.

Our Anti-Profiling Resolution was one of the last items we got through the Senate before the shut down. Senate Resolution 154 passed the Senate unanimously on December 11th. This was a critical issue for the MRF, and as stated by MRF President Kirk "Hardtail" Willard "this act today by the Senate is very important, as it recognizes that the profiling of motorcyclists

because of our mode of transportation or choice of attire is unacceptable". Unfortunately, we were unable to pass the companion bill (H.Res 318) in the House of Representatives before the end of the session. Expect to hear more on this important issue from the MRF in 2019.

Most of our other efforts got sidetracked in the insanity that has been Washington DC for the past few months. We will be moving forward with these in 2019, so look for future developments regarding:

Autonomous vehicles (self-driving cars),

EPA regulation of race track only • vehicles,

Ethanol requirements & labelling for gasoline,

Inclusion of motorcyclists concerns in discussion of highway safety,

Security and ownership of data recorders in vehicles,

Along with continued efforts regarding profiling of motorcyclists.

It looks like 2019 will be a busy year. Can we count on YOUR support of the MRF on the issues important to motorcyclists throughout the USA?

On a separate topic... If anyone has thought that it would be great to attend the big Run to the Wall ride to Washington DC with Rolling Thunder, this will be your last opportunity. Although Rolling Thunder will continue its work on behalf of POW/MIAs, veterans, and active duty military, 2019 will be the last national Run to the Wall. This major rally is being discontinued due to escalating costs involved in running the event. The final Ride to the Wall will take place Memorial Day weekend, May 24-27.

And you can tie your Rolling Thunder participation into another big event in DC. Go early and make a full week out of your trip, by attending the MRF's "Bikers Inside The Beltway" motorcyclist lobbying day on May 21-22. This is the only National Motorcycle Lobby Day held in our nation's Capitol. Detail can be found on the MRF web-site, at www.mrf.org.

I always encourage you to join the MRF, and now there is some extra urgency to my request. Join now and save \$5. The MRF has announced an increase in dues, effective May 20, 2019. Join now at the current rate, before the increase goes into effect. If everyone in CMT/ABATE also joins the MRF, we will vastly improve our ability to influence Washington DC, and become that "irate, tireless minority, keen on setting brushfires of freedom" to ensure that we can continue to . . .





#### Who Are Your Friends?

I like to know who my friends are. I like to know who helps me ride safer and who is working against me. Unfortunately, most riders don't know who their friends are. They don't realize that there is an organization in Washington, DC that has been working for them for the past 20 years. This organization works to make sure that the best interests of motorcyclists' are represented when motorcycle-related issues come up in the US government.

That organization is the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF). The MRF has a full-time lobbyist and office in DC and they are funded by memberships. Most riders don't know about the MRF so they don't support the MRF. I know about the MRF and they are my friends.

The MRF is fighting to make sure my medical claims are paid by my insurance company should I get hurt on my motorcycle. They are fighting to secure funding for rider training and road improvements. Road improvements that include paving streets and fixing pot holes. Riding on safe roads is important to me. They have pressured the EPA for my right to modify and customize my bike – a right that whether you realize it or not – we are losing! The MRF is a national motorcyclists' rights organization (MRO) that is working for the rights of all of America's motorcyclists. The MRF is our voice in Washington, DC and lobbies for fair federal level motorcycle legislation. They also support riders on state level legislative issues as well.

The MRF are not "sport bikers". They are not "Harley people". They are not a" white guys organization", they are not a "black biker organization", they are not a "Hispanic bikers organization", etc. They are bikers! It's not about color, and it's not about the style of riding you do or the type of bike you own.

When a bill turns into a law in Washington, DC, it affects all bikers regardless of race and type of bike. The MRF is bi-partisan. They are partisan about one thing and one thing only – motorcycling. They are women and men of every race, creed, and political party devoted to one cause – riders' rights and safety. MRF members are committed to each other as brothers and sisters.

The MRF's public policy interests are the protection of riders' interests across the board: Highway safety, personal liberty, law enforcement, health care, discrimination, public opinion, highway access, and the relationship between federal power and state prerogatives. They also pressure regulatory agencies like EPA, NHTSA, and NTSB to stay away from discriminatory rulings against motorcyclists.

The MRF was started in 1984 by motorcyclists, and to this day is run by motorcyclists. All financial support for the organization is generated from within the motorcycling population.

This is your chance to thank your friends. Help the people who have been helping you for 20 years. They will keep you informed about issues that directly affect you. The only way to keep yourself educated on the issues that face bikers is to join the MRF and understand what they are doing for you. Joining the MRF costs \$30 per year. Compare that to the value you place on riding. How much did that last piece of chrome cost?
