COVID relief bills, the confirmation of a Supreme Court Justice and the elections. Those are about the only things going anywhere in Washington DC right now. But that gives us time to make some plans for the future. And the timing couldn't be better. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation does some of their major planning at the Meeting of the Minds in September every year. Unfortunately, I was unable to attend this year, but I want to thank Carol Simpson and Larry Binkley for representing Tennessee and CMT/ABATE at this motorcyclists' rights conference. Please talk to them about what went on there and what they learned can help CMT/ABATE.

Perhaps the most important of the plans made at the Meeting of the Minds is the MRF Legislative Agenda for the coming year. This is definitely **NOT** a listing of what the MRF legislative team wants to do. Instead, representatives from all of the States in attendance sit down to review last year's priorities, and determine what the MRF needs to work on over the next year. This provides direction for the MRF, and sets priorities for what they really need to work on, what would be nice to accomplish, and what we need to keep an eye on. I have included the details of the MRF legislative agenda in a separate article, and it will also be included in the next issue of the American Bikers Journal, which is one of your benefits as an MRF member (you ARE a member aren't you?).

This is also a good time for us to make plans for the future for CMT/ABATE and our local charters. An important part of that planning is the legislative update session that we have begun holding on the afternoon of our annual New Years Kick-Off party. This is currently planned for January (assuming COVID-19 doesn't

force a change to that). If you can attend, it has been a very informative session in the past, and that way you'll already be there when the party starts.

Planning for the future has never been one of the strong points of our movement. We are generally much better at reacting to issues as they arise. But that is not a good formula for long-term success. If we want to really make an impact, we need to know where we want to go, and have the roadmap to get there. The time to make plans is now. They don't have to be perfect – we can always modify them as needed. But we need our roadmap, and then follow through on those plans to reach our goal of ensuring our right to...



### **Legislative Agenda set during Meeting of the Minds 2020**

One of the most important events at Meeting of the Minds is the legislative strategy session. Each year, during this session, State motorcycle rights groups develop the federal legislative priorities for the following year. Items are discussed, debated and eventually voted on, with each Sustaining State Motorcyclists' Rights Organization (SSMRO) having a voice and a vote. Legislative priorities are placed in one of three categories, "High," "Medium" and "Monitor". These priorities will serve as a roadmap, for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation Washington D.C. team, as we focus on 2021.

While you can see the full detailed list of priorities in the next American Bikers' Journal, below is brief preview of the "High" priority items approved during the session.

- Profiling: Continue pursuit of the House anti-profiling resolution mirroring the Senate version that passed unanimously. Build momentum for inclusion of anti-profiling language in other legislation.
- Renewable Fuels: Advocate for targeted changes to the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS).
- Autonomous Vehicles: Advocate and monitor any legislation or regulations related to motorcycles concerning connected and autonomous vehicles.
- Emission Regulations: Engage the EPA & Congress on any activity related to motorcycle emission regulations.
- Definition of a Motorcycle: Educate policymakers and advocate for change to current definition, that better reflects the current two- and three-wheel motorcycle landscape.
- Crash Avoidance: Continue to promote the theme of crash avoidance versus safer crashing urging NHTSA and the DOT to focus on crash prevention and rider education.
- Helmet Laws: Oppose any mandatory federal helmet, apparel or conspicuity standards.
- Black Box: Pursue legislative language that any collected or available vehicle data is the property of the consumer and in which the consumer has the choice to opt-out of having their personal data communicated to interested parties.
- Surface Transportation Reauthorization (Highway Bill): Advocate and pursue legislative efforts that impact motorcyclists in the Highway Bill, now set to expire in 2021.



### MEETING OF THE MINDS 2020

Until we attended "Meeting of the Minds", We never knew how much of a process it is to get bills made. And be presented not to mention the work and comprise it takes to get them passed. It takes a lot of dedication and hard work, not to mention pereverance. Those who are able to do this work deserve our utmost respect.

able to do this work deserve our utmost respect.

We attended several of the workshops at least as many as we could in two days time. We came back with our heads full of ideas spilling over. Not to mention numerous pages of notes.

To sit and talk with others and learn what they have tried and what has succeeded with growing their memberships, and sustaining them. It gives us thoughts on how we can implement some of those here.

on how we can implement some of those here.

On a Federal level the biggest bill that is in the works is H.Res 255. This is the bill against antiprofiling resolution. If it does not pass by January 2, 2021, it will have to be re-introduced. All the cosponsors we currently have on this bill will automatically be on the one if we have to re-introduce it.

It all comes down to one thing, "AWARENESS". Sharing the information and taking a stand. Profiling is a huge problem for all riders and individuals. Remember to always use the "3 R's;

### RIDE-RECORD-REPORT all profiling.

The MRF plans to work with the appropiate stake holders cocerning the federal definition of a motorcycle. Ensuring that crash and fatality statistics continue to be seperate from other types of vehciles. To not blame a fatlity stating they weren't wearing a helmet", or "they were traveling at a high rate of speed". Facts, TRUE FACTS need to be stated. If a biker dies because a car hit them, lets stop brushing it off. The driver always claims "I didn't seem them", or "they came out of nowhere flying". What do they receive you may ask? In most cases not even a ticket, it is excused because it was a motorcycle. Let's fight for strictor laws and not brushing it under the rug. 


